



April Commentary

Your Fund returned +7.2% during the month compared to +4.3% for the MSCI World Index NR (£).

As long-term investors we tend not to place a lot of importance on quarterly earnings, but as we lap the beginning of the pandemic in 2020, and start to reopen in earnest, first quarter numbers from the Fund's largest holdings have been instructive. We have discussed the digitisation of commerce often, but it remains our strong contention that this powerful force is only in the elementary stages and is the most important investment theme of the decade. Starting with Alphabet, a wonderful example of the persistent

inefficiency we often find in the market pricing of big, well-known companies. Revenues grew at an astonishing +34%, with Google Search revenues growing +30%, YouTube revenues up +49% and Google Cloud +46%. Operating margins expanded to 30% and Alphabet ended the period with \$135bn in cash. Microsoft similarly benefited from an acceleration in digital transformation, with +19% revenue growth, +31% growth in operating income and expansion in operating margins to 41%. The numbers for Facebook are just as eye popping, with 2.7 billion people using at least one of their services in March. Facebook's revenue grew just shy of +50% year-on-year, underpinned by growth

in digital advertising and online commerce. Operating cashflow and margins expanded materially and the company ended the quarter with \$64bn in cash. Whilst these results partly reflect the easy comparables of a year ago, they also illustrate more permanent change. As Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella said on the earnings call, 'over a year into the pandemic, digital adoption curves aren't slowing down, in fact they're accelerating and it's just beginning. Digital technology will be the foundation for resilience and growth over the next decade.'
