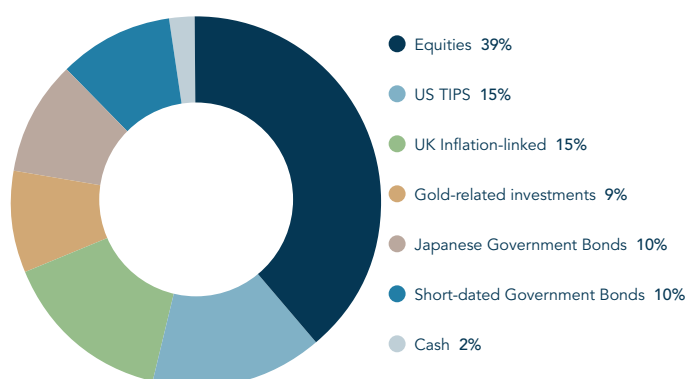

August Commentary

Events in August raised an important question: who sets the price of money? In the US, Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent was trying to ease pressure on long-term government borrowing costs, while Federal Reserve Chair Kevin Warsh used the annual Jackson Hole Symposium to explain how the Fed would respond if inflation stayed too high. Both have influence, but neither has complete control.

Bessent's Treasury announced that it would at least double each buyback of older 10- to 30-year Treasury bonds from \$2bn to \$4bn. Treasuries rallied sharply, but much of the move was quickly reversed. The official aim was to improve liquidity, although the timing was notable as yields approached 20-year highs. Persistent inflation, resilient growth and large fiscal deficits remain difficult forces to wish away. The repurchase amounts are also modest beside a Treasury market measured in trillions, but the precedent may matter more. This is not yet a full [yield curve](#) control (a possibility we have discussed before) but it raises the question of greater intervention ahead.

Jackson Hole offered clarity from a different direction. Warsh had previously given markets little guidance on how he would balance inflation against growth and employment. His speech was clearer: the Fed's 2% inflation target is 'firm',

the labour market remains healthy, and inflation is still too widespread. Warsh stated that inflation must be moving clearly and sufficiently quickly towards target, 'Otherwise, we have work to do'. Markets welcomed the clarity, with expectations of a September interest rate rise increasing.

While Warsh and Bessent both hold some sway, neither can ultimately dictate the return investors will demand to lend for decades. If policymakers increasingly resist higher borrowing costs, the adjustment may instead come through a weaker dollar and greater concern about inflation (an environment that could favour gold). Respecting the market's power is important. We are reminded of US political strategist James Carville who once joked that, if reincarnated, he would return as the bond market: 'You can intimidate everybody'.

We take heed and continue to favour short-dated US and UK index-linked government bonds in the Fund's fixed-income allocation. We value the inflation protection they provide, while limiting the risk that comes with lending to governments for longer durations.
