At least 60% of its assets will be invested in UK equities and equity-related securities. A maximum of 30% of its assets may also be invested in overseas equities and equity-related securities.





June Commentary


Your Fund delivered a total return of +1.5% during the month compared to +0.2% for the FTSE All-Share Index (TR). This positive monthly return continues the trend of improved performance since the end of February, the point at which the sharp sector rotation that had dominated the previous four months gave way to broader market leadership. As we have often said, such extreme changes of market sentiment can have a significant impact on short-term relative performance. However, it is our firm belief that over the longer term the Fund's differentiated investment style will deliver competitive returns.

Individual companies that performed well in the month included both the portfolio's Swiss and UK pharmaceutical companies, with Roche being the best-performing stock in the Fund. Significant contributions also came from a diverse range of other holdings including Paychex, RELX, American Express and Experian. Many of these same high-quality companies had fallen out of favour during the months following the emergence of a COVID-19 vaccine. As highlighted in our February comentary, we try to look through such swings in market sentiment and focus on the strength of the underlying business. As a consequence, we did not only stick with these core portfolio holdings but added to stocks such as Experian when their valuations appeared depressed to us.

As the global economy continues to move into a post-pandemic phase, led by more fully vaccinated nations such as the UK, the longer-term impact of the virus, both human and economic, will become apparent. The coming

months will determine whether the sharp rises in the price of some commodities and products are being caused by temporary bottlenecks or something more permanent that can challenge the disinflationary trends which have prevailed over recent years. The resulting inflationary outcome and the associated monetary and fiscal responses will be critical in determining the near-term behaviour of equity markets.

There is a sharp contrast between the uncertainty that surrounds these short-term market movements and our confidence in the ability of the portfolio's companies to create value for shareholders and society over the long term. It is this difference we will continue to seek to exploit on behalf of our investors.
