

### July Commentary

Your Fund returned +2.3% during the month compared to +4.4% for the FTSE All-Share Index (TR).

July saw equity and bond markets rally, with the MSCI World equity index returning +7.7% in sterling, partially reversing the damage seen in markets during a torrid first six months of the year. This change in fortune reflects a fading of recession fears and a hope that the US Federal Reserve may slow the pace of interest rate rises after a further +75bps rate increase in late July. The more optimistic mood is unsurprising after several months of extremely negative investor sentiment.

Today investors are struggling to reconcile a world of high historical valuations, high inflation and tightening monetary conditions. Central banks are a long way behind the curve on required interest rate rises, with the latest data published in July showing US annual inflation of +9.1%,

while US benchmark interest rates are 2.25%-2.5%. It appears wishful thinking to expect inflation to be tamed, central bank interest rate rises to moderate and to avoid recession, amid all the myriad political and economic challenges that we face. Central bankers have their hands tied by historically high debt levels. 'Soft landings' are rare.


History informs us that valuations fall as inflation rises. As described in <a href="Investment Report No.73">Investment Report No.73</a>, published in July, stock prices are reliant on earnings growth alongside a valuation multiple on those earnings.

The investment backdrop has become considerably more challenging in the past six months, but the environment should benefit disciplined and risk-averse investors, prepared to bide their time for more attractive valuations.
