

October Commentary

Your Fund returned -0.4% during the month compared to +3.9% for the MSCI World Index NR (f).

The Fund's investments across the payments sector were the single largest drag on the Fund's returns in the month. Sentiment towards the sector has recently soured for a broad number of reasons, not all of which are connected. They range from the purported disruption of incumbents by fintechs; an ongoing U.S. anti-trust investigation into Visa's online debit practices; mixed financial results (from Fiserv); underwhelming guidance for the coming year (from Visa); and PayPal's rumoured discussions to acquire

Pinterest - since quashed, for now. There is some substance to pick through here, and lots of noise. We can offer a few general observations. First, investors are apt to conceive markets as 'zero-sum' - i.e. my growth comes at the cost of yours. The global payments sector is extraordianarily large and dynamic and its digitisation remains relatively immature. There is lots of growth to go around and the success of any one company is not necessarily at the expense of another. Second, our more established businesses are adapting well to technological change. We find evidence for this in Visa's and Mastercard's many partnerships with fintechs, including those with buy-now-pay-later

(BNPL) providers, mobile wallets and cryptocurrency services. We also see it in the outstanding scale and growth of Fiserv's Clover platform, together with PayPal's expanded product offering, encompassing BNPL, crypto, offline payments and more.

This year, we have added to the Fund's holdings in Fiserv and Mastercard, and cut holdings in PayPal and American Express, primarily on valuation grounds. In aggregate, we see the Fund's payments investments as a valuable source of high-quality growth.
